What is this Product?

You are purchasing shares in a English company quoted on the Access segment of the Aquis Growth Market — which is operated by the Aquis Stock Exchange Limited (Aquis Stock Exchange), a recognised investment exchange under Part XVIII of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 (FSMA). The exchange is a market designed primarily for emerging or smaller companies to which a higher investment risk tends to be attached than to larger or more established companies.

The Company intends to be a technology specialist investor that will invest the majority of its cash resources in the acquisition of minority interests in companies operating in the 'FinTech' sector. Fuller details are set out in the Admission Document available atwww.dispersionholdings.com

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. There is no recommended holding period for this investment. Investments in Dispersion must however be regarded as a long term investment. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less than you invested.

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- There can be no certainty that the Company will be able to acquire and/or sell its intended underlying portfolio on acceptable terms or at all;
